USDA's carcass weight data showed weights averaged 921 lbs. this week, compared to 923 lbs. last week and 885 lbs. last year.

This was 9.8 percent lower than a week ago and 3.0 percent higher than a year ago. Cumulative meat production for the year to date was 0.8 percent lower compared to the previous year.

Alberta direct cattle sales so far this week have seen light trade develop with dressed sales reported at \$438.00/cwt delivered, steady to \$6.00/cwt higher than the previous week. Cattle that traded were being scheduled anywhere from the week of June 10th to June 27th delivery. Fed cattle prices have been higher in 9 out of the past 10 weeks. Over that timeframe prices have rallied \$28.00/cwt. New record highs were established this week. From an industry perspective, the situation in eastern Canada is concerning. Labor talks between Cargill and the union are likely on going. Cattle from Eastern Canada are coming West into Alberta for slaughter.

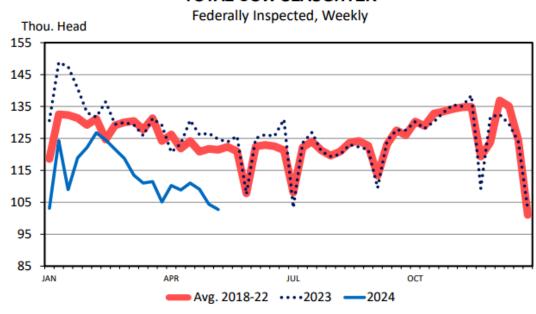

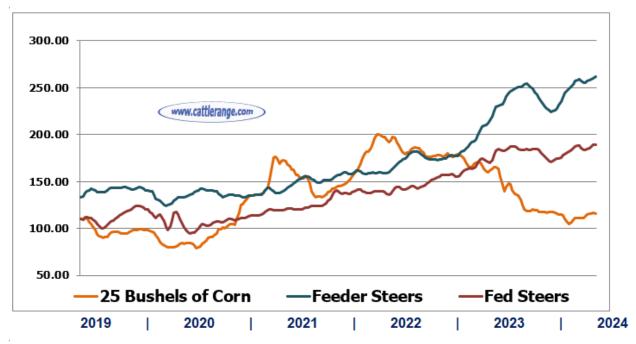

Beef:

Net sales of 15,700 MT for 2024 were down 27 percent from the previous week and 12 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases were primarily for Japan (4,500 MT, including decreases of 700 MT), China (2,800 MT, including decreases of 300 MT), Mexico (1,500 MT, including decreases of 100 MT), Taiwan (1,300 MT, including decreases of 100 MT), and Hong Kong (1,300 MT).

Exports of 16,100 MT were down 7 percent from the previous week, but up 1 percent from the prior 4-week average. The destinations were primarily to South Korea (4,200 MT), Japan (3,700 MT), China (2,800 MT), Mexico (1,500 MT), and Taiwan (1,300 MT).

Pork:

Net sales of 44,400 MT for 2024 were up 69 percent from the previous week and from the prior 4-week average. Increases were primarily for Mexico (23,200 MT, including decreases of 300 MT), Australia (6,100 MT), Japan (3,600 MT, including decreases of 300 MT), Canada (2,600 MT, including decreases of 600 MT), and China (2,400 MT). Total net sales of 100 MT for 2024/2025 were for Australia.

Exports of 34,700 MT were up 1 percent from the previous week, but unchanged from the prior 4-week average. The destinations were primarily to Mexico (14,600 MT), Japan (4,100 MT), South Korea (4,000 MT), China (3,100 MT), and Colombia (2,300 MT).

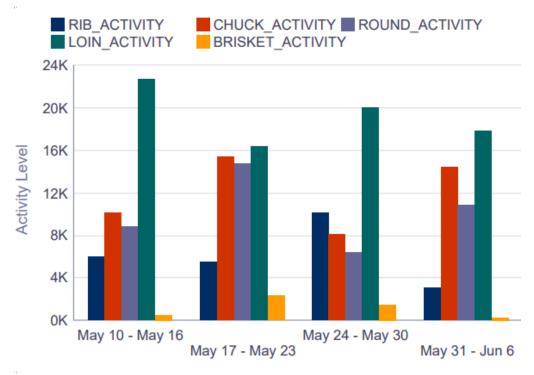

The theory behind the "Bullish/Bearish Consensus" indicator is when the public reaches a consensus, they are usually wrong:

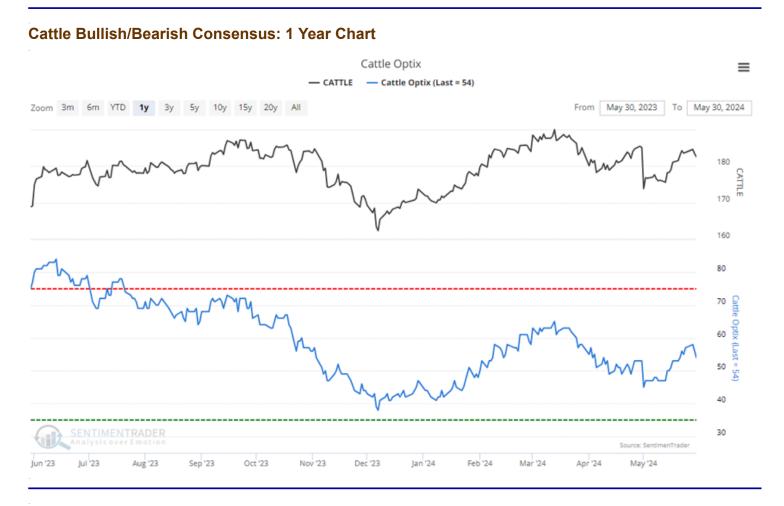
They get too bullish after prices have risen and too bearish after they have already fallen.

Because of this tendency, there are often extremes in opinion right before major changes in trend:

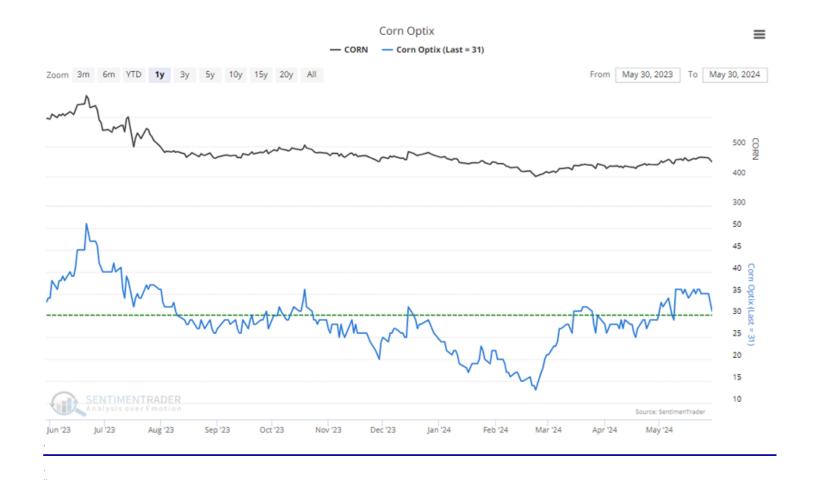
- When the public reaches a bullish extreme, i.e., a great majority thinks prices will keep rising, then prices often decline instead.
- And when they become too bearish, then prices tend to rise.

So when Public Opinion moves above the **red dotted line** in the chart, it means that compared to other readings over the past year, you're seeing **excessive optimism**. You also want to look at the absolute level of Opinion, too - if it's at 90%, then there's no question we're seeing an historic level of bullish opinion. Watch for readings above 80% (or especially 90%) to spot those dangerous times when the public is overly enthusiastic about a commodity.

Conversely, when Public Opinion moves below the **green dotted line**, then the public is **excessively pessimistic** about the commodity's prospects for further gains compared to their opinion over the past year. Looking for absolute readings under 20% (or especially 10%) often indicates an upturn in the market.

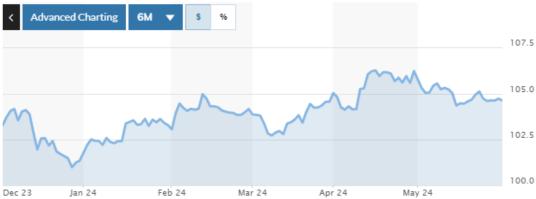


Corn Bullish/Bearish Consensus: 1 Year Chart

Growth shares lead stocks lower

Most of the major benchmarks closed lower over the holiday-shortened week but rounded out a month of gains. In contrast to much of the month, small-caps performed better than large-caps, and value stocks

held up better than growth shares. The technology-heavy Nasdaq Composite was especially weak, due in part to a sharp decline in cloud software provider Salesforce, which fell sharply after releasing first-quarter revenues that missed consensus estimates. Markets were shuttered Monday in observance of the Memorial Day holiday.

The catalysts for the week's moves were arguably harder to detect than usual. Much of the week's relatively light economic calendar came in roughly in line with expectations, most notably the Commerce Department's personal consumption expenditure (PCE) price index report, released Friday morning. Core (less food and energy) PCE prices - widely considered the Federal Reserve's preferred inflation gauge - rose 0.2% in April, down slightly from the previous two months and seemingly a period of calming inflation pressures following January's 0.5% spike.

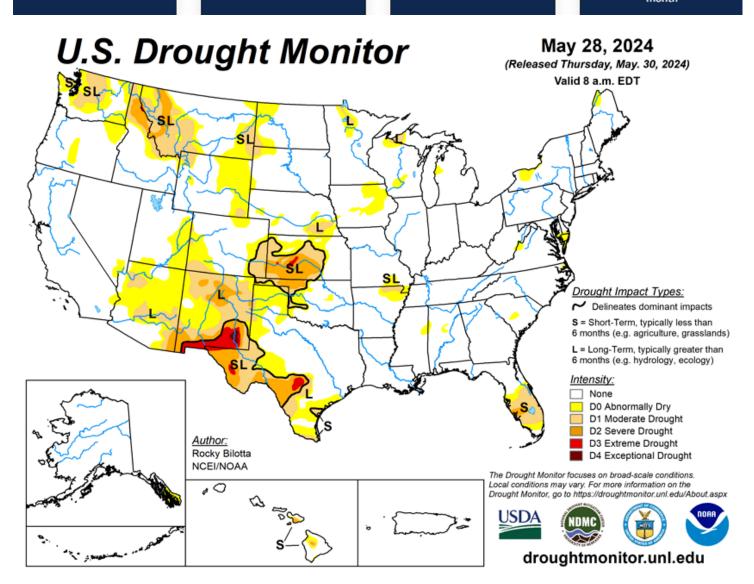

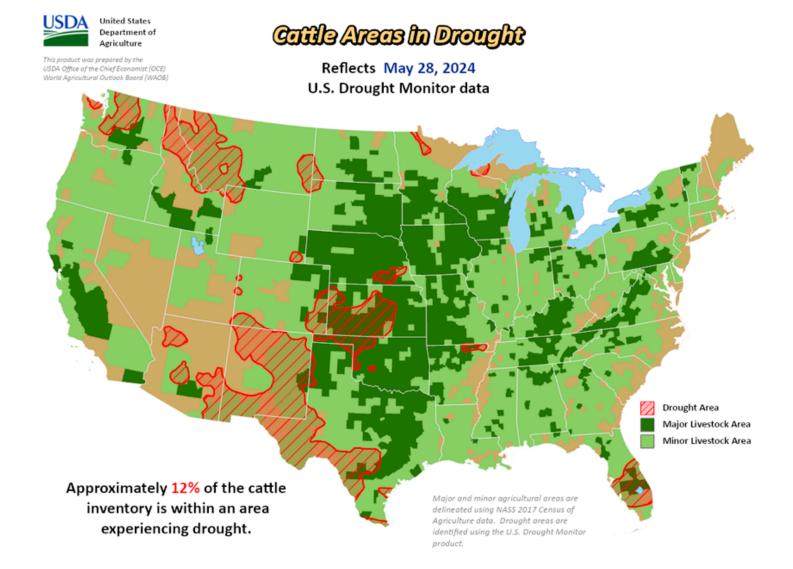

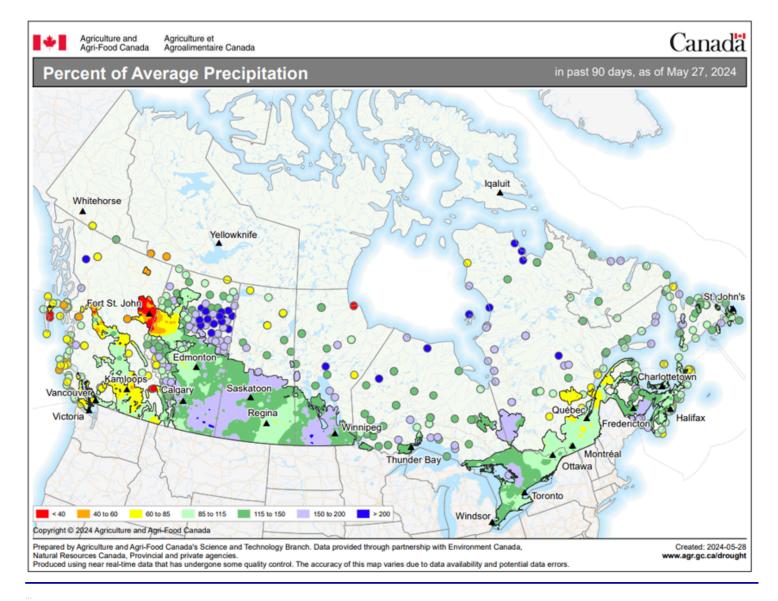

Canadian 90-Day Percent of Average Precipitation:

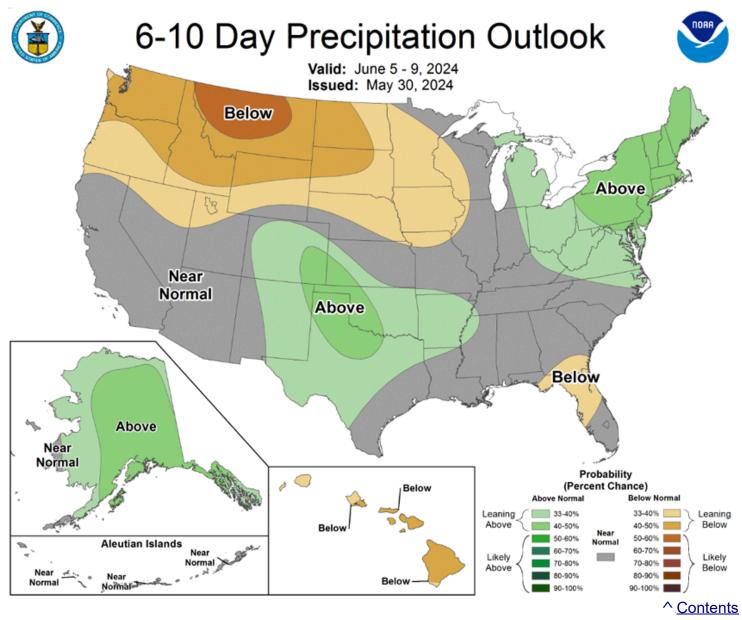


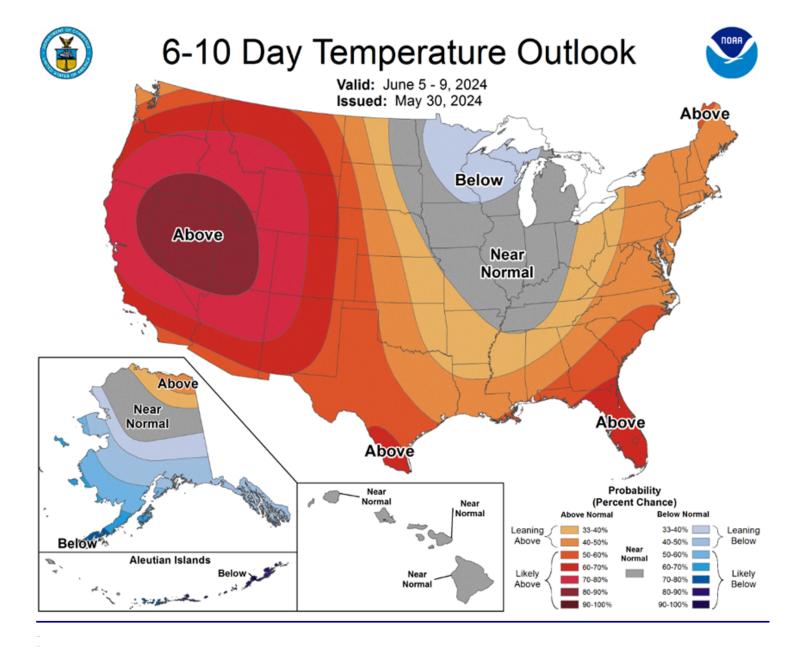
Looking ahead...

During the next five days (May 28–June 1, 2024), moisture convergence along a frontal boundary and east of a dryline across Texas and Oklahoma will likely generate scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms, with the potential for episodes of locally heavy rainfall early to mid-week. The threat of heavy rainfall will be highest in Texas Tuesday into Wednesday as an upper level shortwave moves over the southern Plains, where the potential exists for storms with rainfall rates approaching 2 inches per hour. The coverage of showers and storms will likely expand north across the central and northern Plains later in the week as an organized frontal system moves into the central U.S. from the Rockies. Locally heavy rainfall will be possible across portions of the Rockies going into late Friday and early Saturday as the cold front intercepts an increasingly humid airmass. In terms of temperatures, the Gulf Coast region will continue to remain hot and humid on Tuesday before some limited relief arrives by midweek as a cold front drops southward. However, the heat and humidity will likely continue across Deep South Texas and South Florida with highs running up to 10 degree above average, and heat indices in the 100-110 degree range, especially for southern Texas. Some triple digit heat is also likely for the lower elevations of the Desert Southwest, but very low humidity here will help keep heat indices in check.

The Climate Prediction Center's 6-10 day outlook (valid June 2–6, 2024) favors above-normal precipitation along much of the West Coast, from the southern Plains to the East Coast, and across much of Alaska, with below-normal precipitation across most of the interior West and Hawaii. Increased probabilities for above-normal temperatures are forecast for Hawaii and much of the contiguous U.S.,

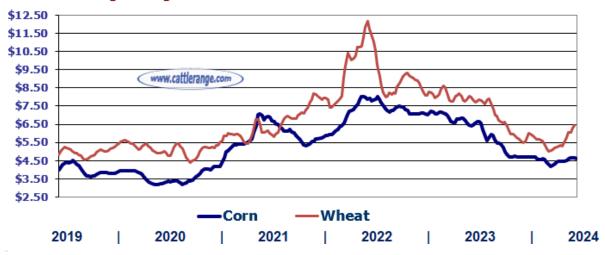
