For the week ending January 12, 2024

**For the week** in the Southern Plains, there was limited fed cattle trade at 172.00 with Northern Plains trade at 175.00. Feeder cattle were 1.50 higher with stocker calves 6.00 higher. Live cattle futures were slightly higher while feeder cattle futures were about 3.00 higher. The dressed beef cutouts were sharply higher with corn lower.

**Fed Cattle:** Limited trade in the South at 172.00 with Northern trade 4.00 steady at 175.00. In the 3 front months, Live Cattle futures closed the week from 0.07 to 0.80 higher. USDA's carcass weight data showed weights averaged 941 lbs. this week, compared to 942 lbs. last week, and 915 lbs. last year.

**Slaughter Cows:** Trade mostly 2.00 lower to 4.00 higher.

**Total red meat production** under Federal inspection for the week ending Saturday, January 13th was estimated at 961.1 million lbs. according to the USDA Marketing Service. This was 2.0 percent lower than a week ago and 15.4 percent lower than a year ago. Cumulative meat production for the year to date was 8.5 percent lower compared to the previous year.

**Corn:** Omaha Corn was 0.14 lower at 4.56 with March futures at 4.4700, 0.1375 lower.

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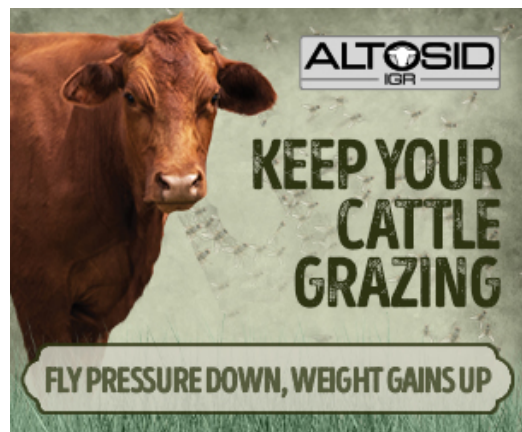

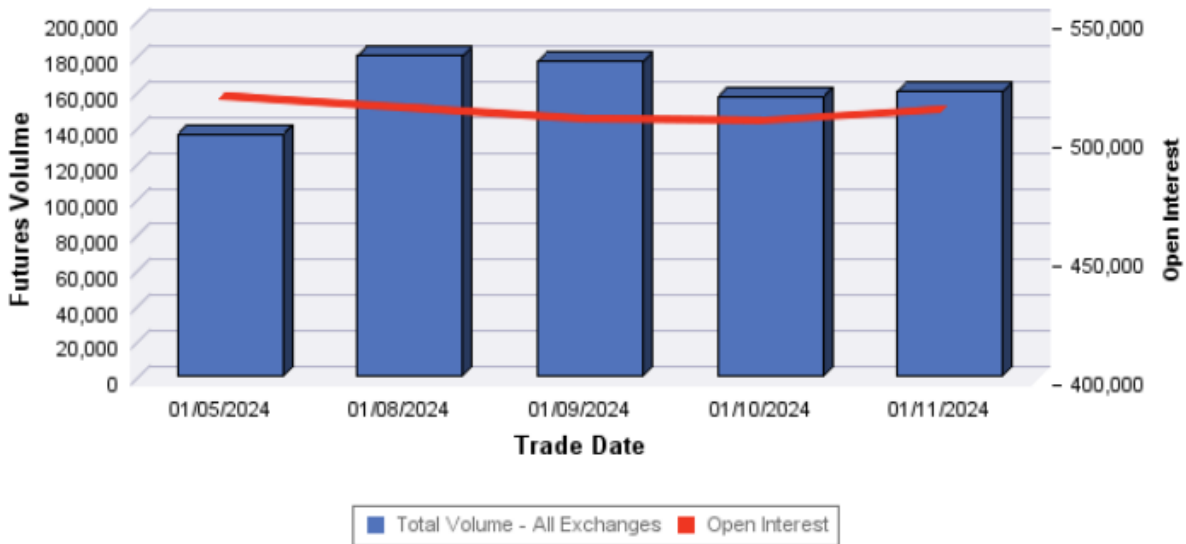

anywhere from late January to mid-March delivery, depending on the packer. With longer pick up times some producers were negotiating flat bids with no heavy weight carcass discounts.

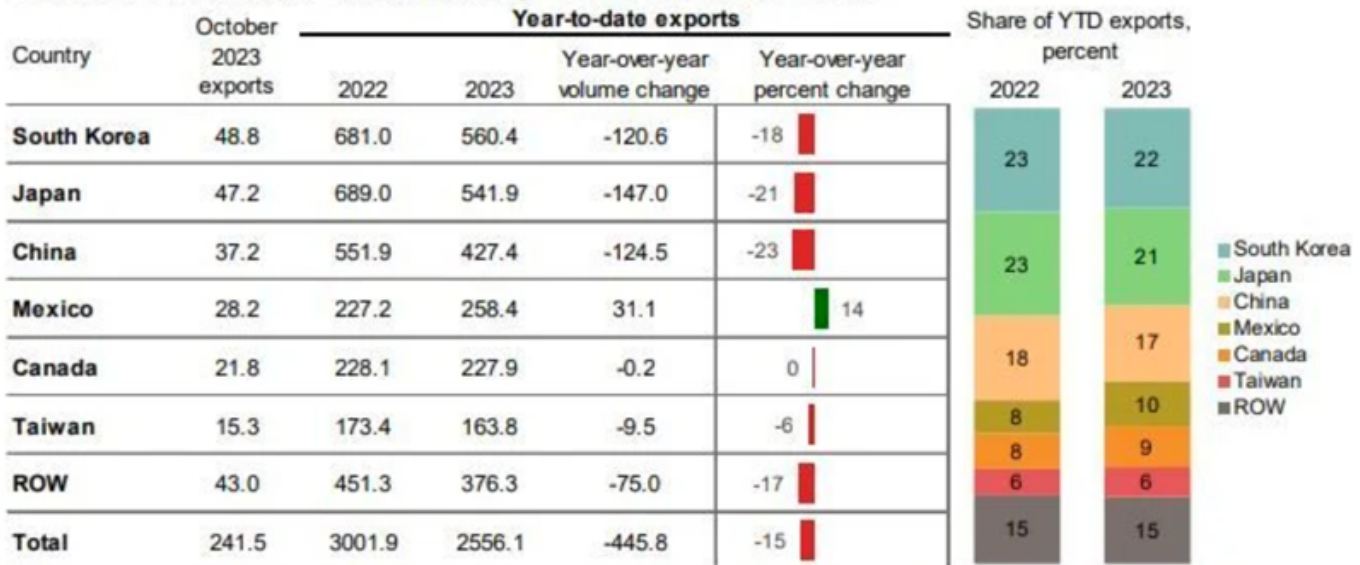

**As of 3:00 PM Friday in the Southern Plains**, negotiated cash trading has been limited with light demand. A few live FOB purchases have traded at 172.00, however, not enough for a full market trend. Last week in the Southern Plains live FOB purchases traded from 172.00-173.00. In Nebraska negotiated cash trade has been slow with light demand. Thus far for the week live FOB purchases traded steady to 2.00 lower at 173.00 and dressed delivered purchases traded 0.50-2.00 lower from 272.00-275.00. In the Western Cornbelt negotiated cash trade has been mostly inactive with light demand. Not enough

purchases for a market trend. Thursday was the fully reported market with live FOB purchases at 175.00 and dressed delivered purchases 275.00, a light test of dressed purchases was noted.

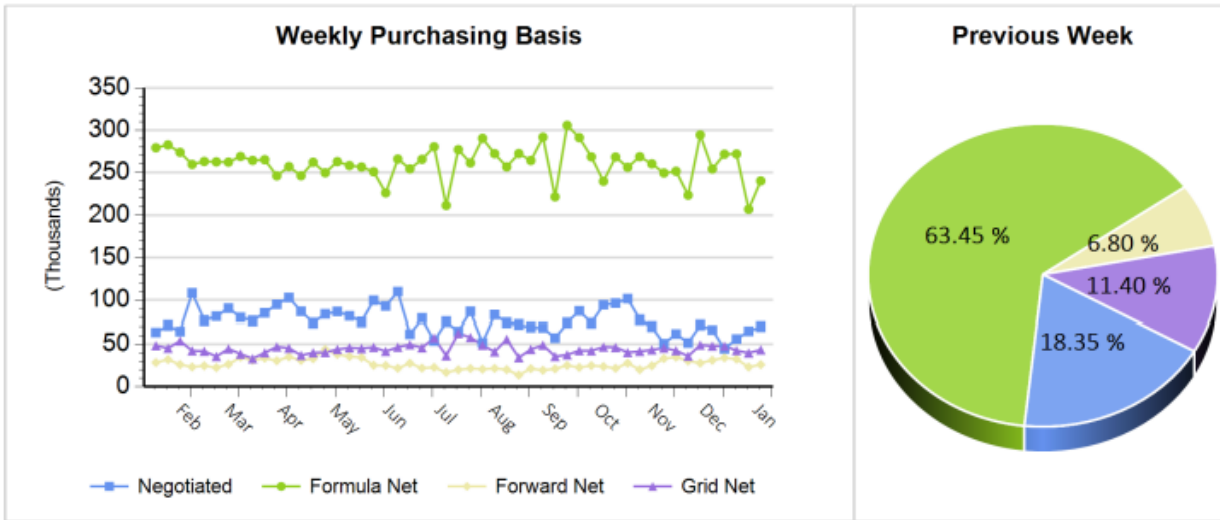

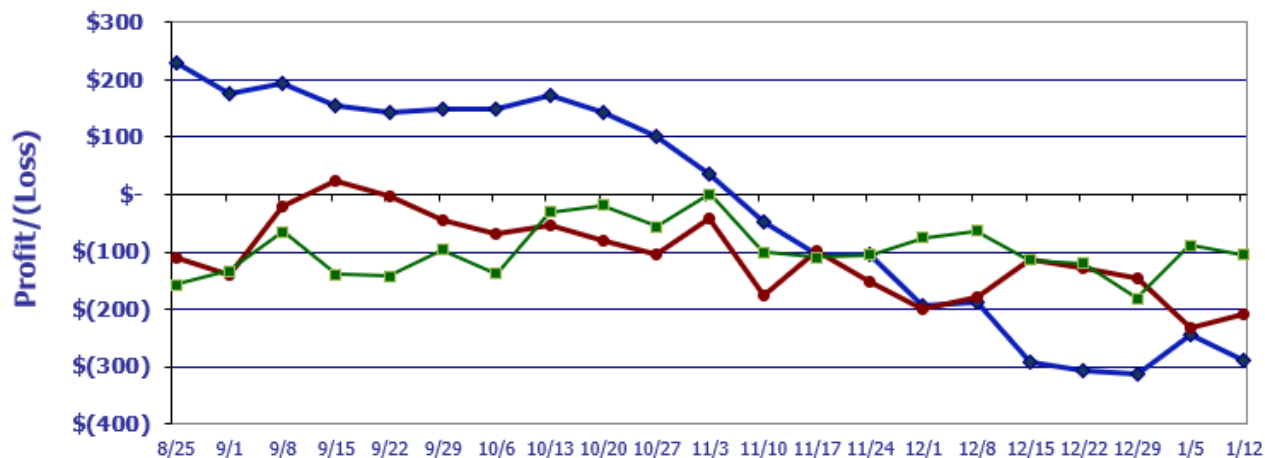

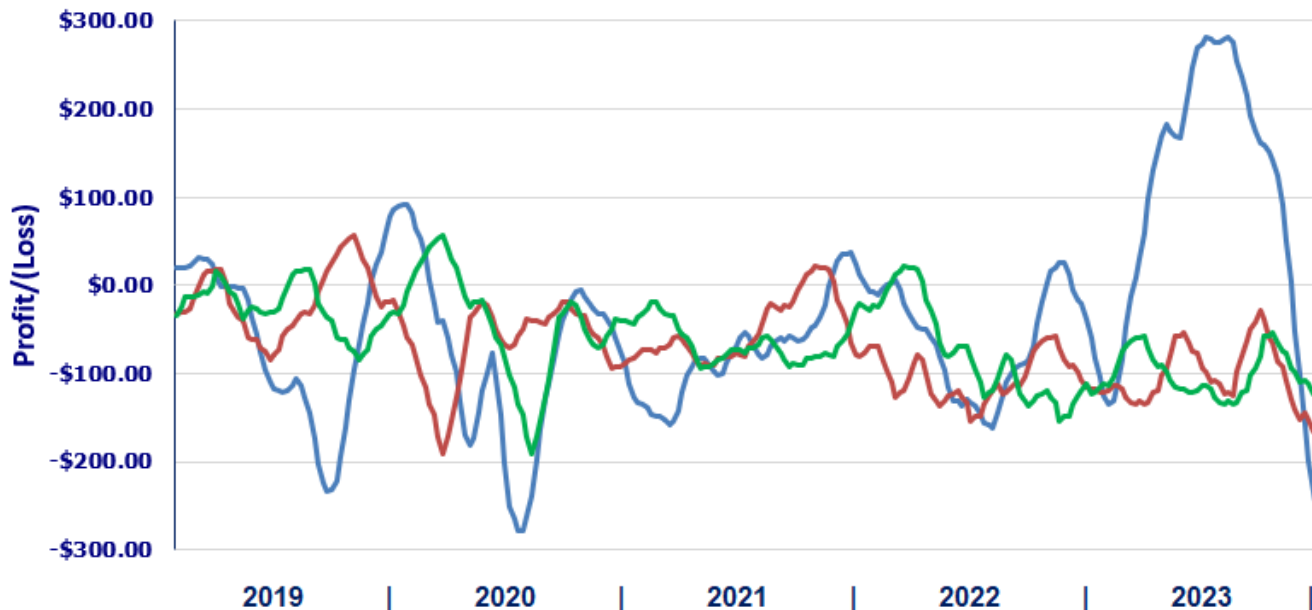

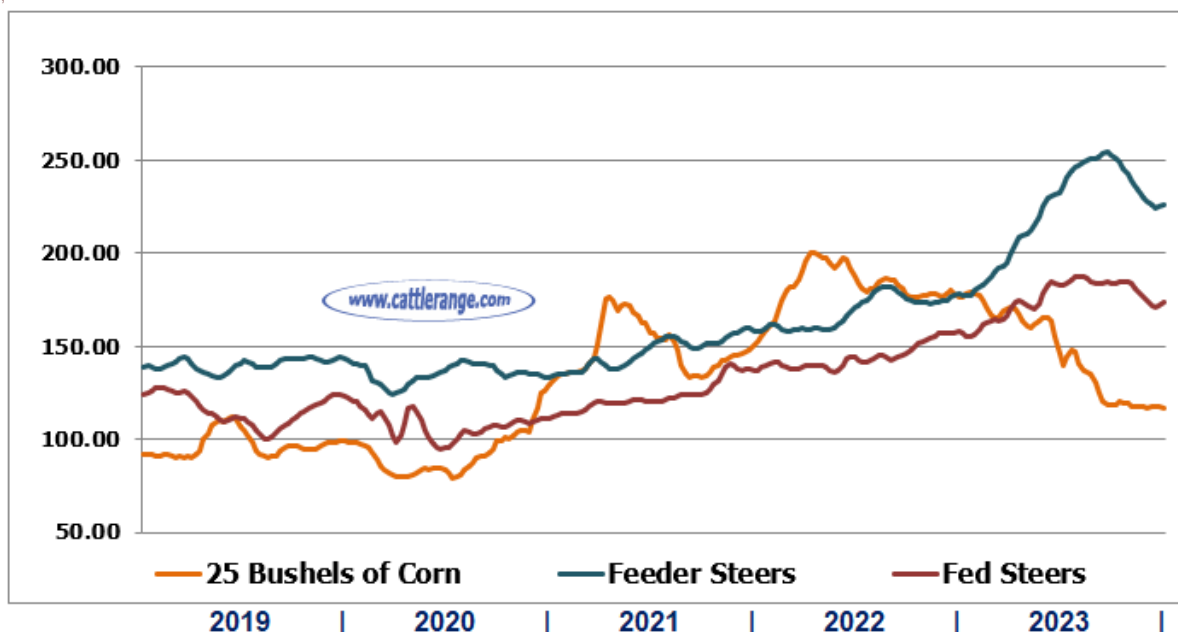

#### Beef:

**Net sales for 2024 marketing year**, which began January 1st, totaled 12,200 MT were primarily for Japan (3,300 MT, including decreases of 200 MT), South Korea (2,400 MT, including decreases of 400 MT), China (2,300 MT, including decreases of 100 MT), Taiwan (1,300 MT, including decreases of 100 MT), and Mexico (1,300 MT, including decreases of 100 MT). Net sales reductions of 900 MT were carried over from the 2023 marketing year, which ended December 31st.

**Exports for the period ending December 31st of 6,600 MT** brought accumulated exports to 810,200 MT, down 14 percent from the prior year total of 942,000 MT. The primary destinations were to South Korea (1,800 MT), Japan (1,400 MT), Taiwan (900 MT), China (800 MT), and Mexico (700 MT).

#### Pork:

**Net sales for 2024 marketing year**, which began January 1st, totaled 23,300 MT were primarily for Mexico (7,400 MT, including decreases of 200 MT), Japan (4,300 MT, including decreases of 200 MT), South Korea (4,100 MT, including decreases of 900 MT), Canada (2,000 MT, including decreases of 600 MT), and Colombia (1,400 MT, including decreases of 100 MT). Net sales reductions of 73,500 MT were carried over from the 2023 marketing year, which ended December 31st.

**Exports of the period ending December 31st of 10,500 MT** brought accumulated exports to 1,580,000 MT, up 5 percent from the prior year total of 1,502,900 MT. The primary destinations were to Mexico (5,300 MT), South Korea (1,200 MT), Japan (900 MT), China (700 MT), and Colombia (700 MT).

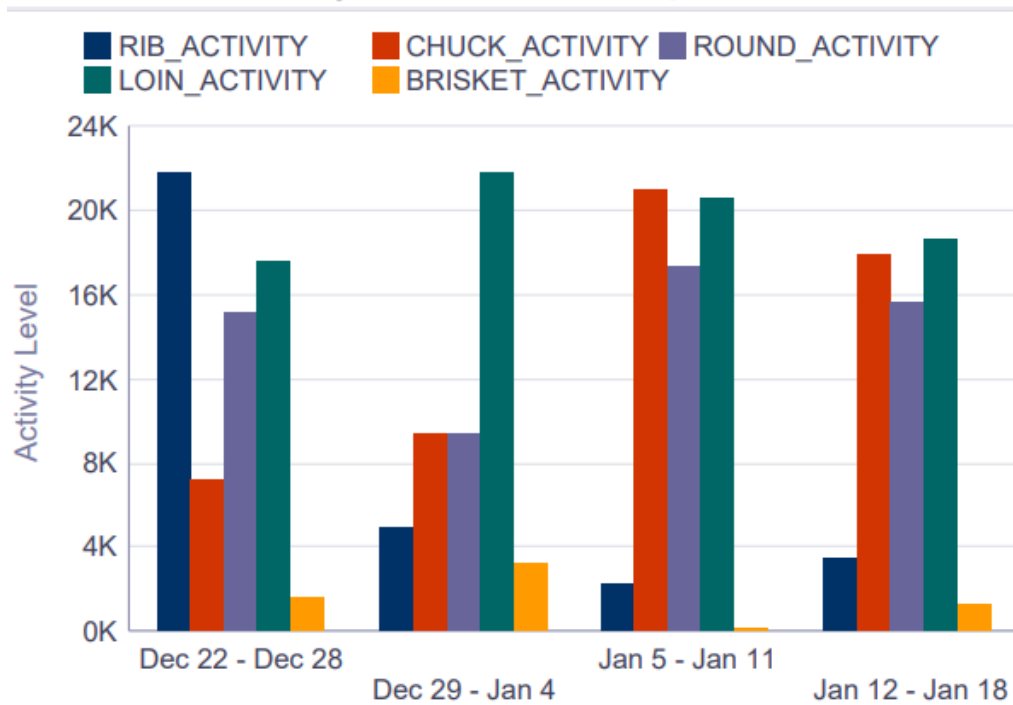
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**USDA National Retail Beef Report:**

This was 2.0 percent lower than a week ago and 15.4 percent lower than a year ago. Cumulative meat production for the year to date was 8.5 percent lower compared to the previous year.

The theory behind the "Bullish/Bearish Consensus" indicator is when the public reaches a consensus, they are usually wrong:

- They get too bullish after prices have risen and too bearish after they have already fallen.

Because of this tendency, there are often extremes in opinion right before major changes in trend:

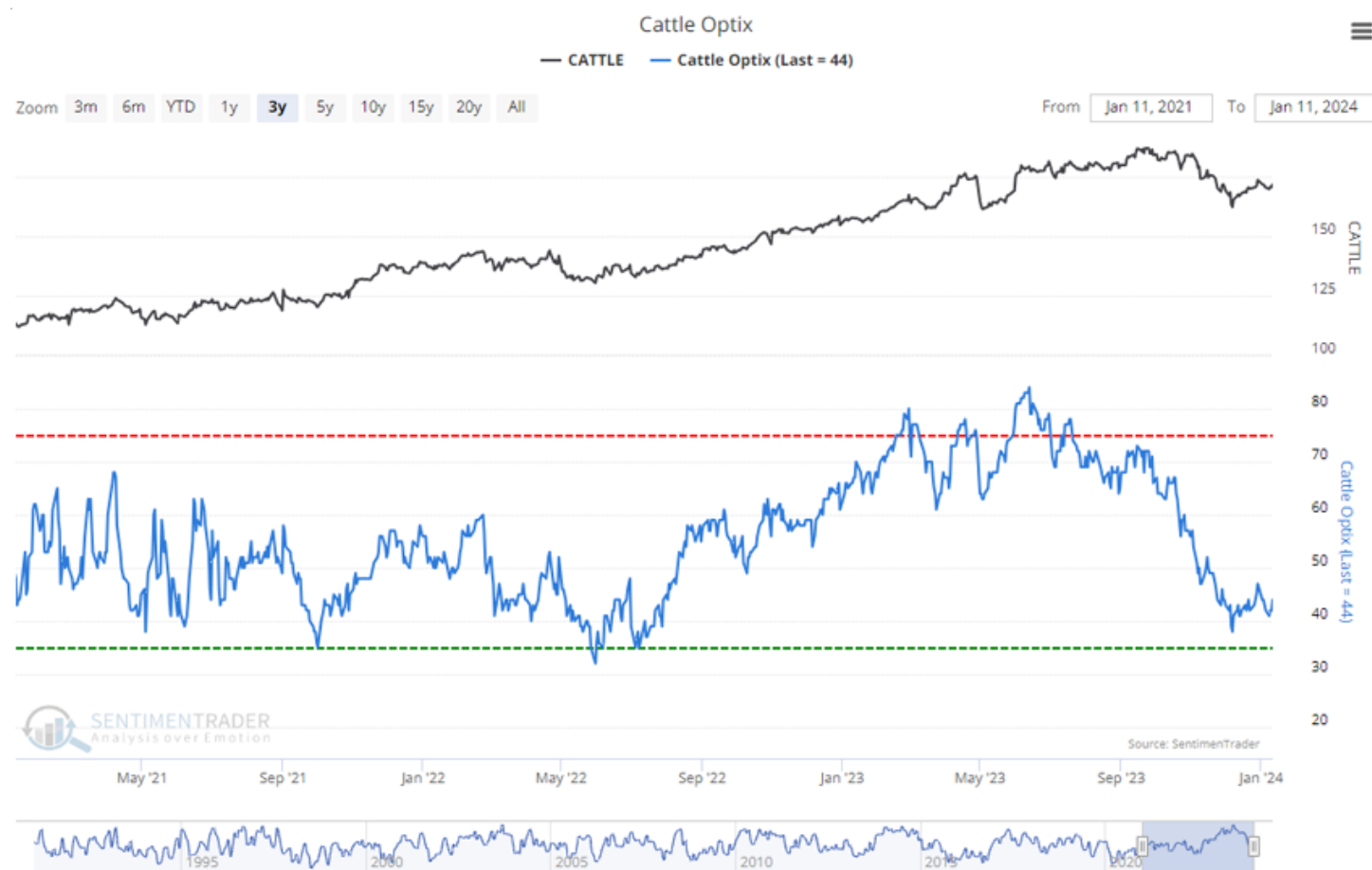
- When the public reaches a bullish extreme, i.e., a great majority thinks prices will keep rising, then prices often decline instead.
- And when they become too bearish, then prices tend to rise.

So when Public Opinion moves above the **red dotted line** in the chart, it means that compared to other readings over the past year, you're seeing **excessive optimism**. You also want to look at the absolute level of Opinion, too - if it's at 90%, then there's no question we're seeing an historic level of bullish opinion. Watch for readings above 80% (or especially 90%) to spot those dangerous times when the public is overly enthusiastic about a commodity.

Conversely, when Public Opinion moves below the **green dotted line**, then the public is **excessively pessimistic** about the commodity's prospects for further gains compared to their opinion over the past year. Looking for absolute readings under 20% (or especially 10%) often indicates an upturn in the market.

**Stocks resume advance as earnings season kicks off**

Stocks moved higher over the week, with large-cap growth stocks and the technology-heavy Nasdaq Composite Index outperforming the broader market. Several tech giants recorded solid gains, including Facebook parent Meta Platforms and chipmaker NVIDIA. Energy stocks underperformed as oil prices pulled back early in the week. The week brought the unofficial start of earnings season, with the nation's four largest banks—JPMorgan Chase, Citigroup, Bank of America, and Wells Fargo—reporting fourth-quarter results on Friday. Markets were scheduled to be closed the following Monday in observance of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day holiday.

### Consumer inflation surprises on the upside, producer inflation on the downside

Data releases on the week's light economic calendar came in roughly in line with expectations, but investors appeared to pay especially close attention to inflation data. Stocks wavered a bit on Thursday morning following the Labor Department's release of consumer price inflation data. Headline prices rose 0.3% in December, a tick more than expected, but core (less food and energy) costs also rose 0.3%, in line with consensus. For 2023 as a whole, core prices rose 3.9%, marking the slowest 12-month pace since mid-2021.

Producer price data, released Friday morning, was somewhat more encouraging. Headline wholesale prices fell another 0.1% in December, marking the third consecutive monthly decline. For 2023 as a whole, prices rose 1.0%, while core prices increased 1.8%, less than expected and below the Federal Reserve's overall inflation target of 2.0%.

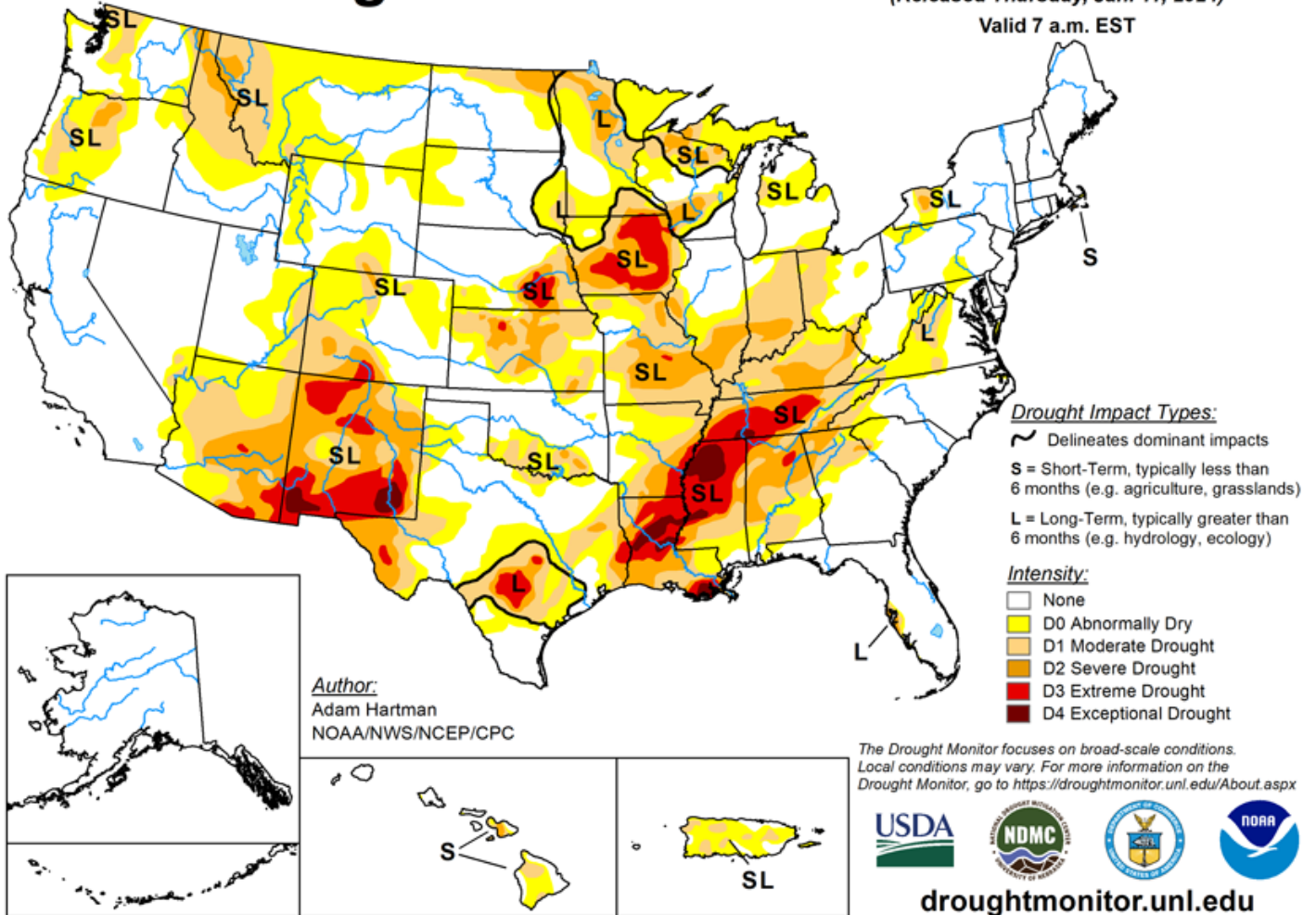

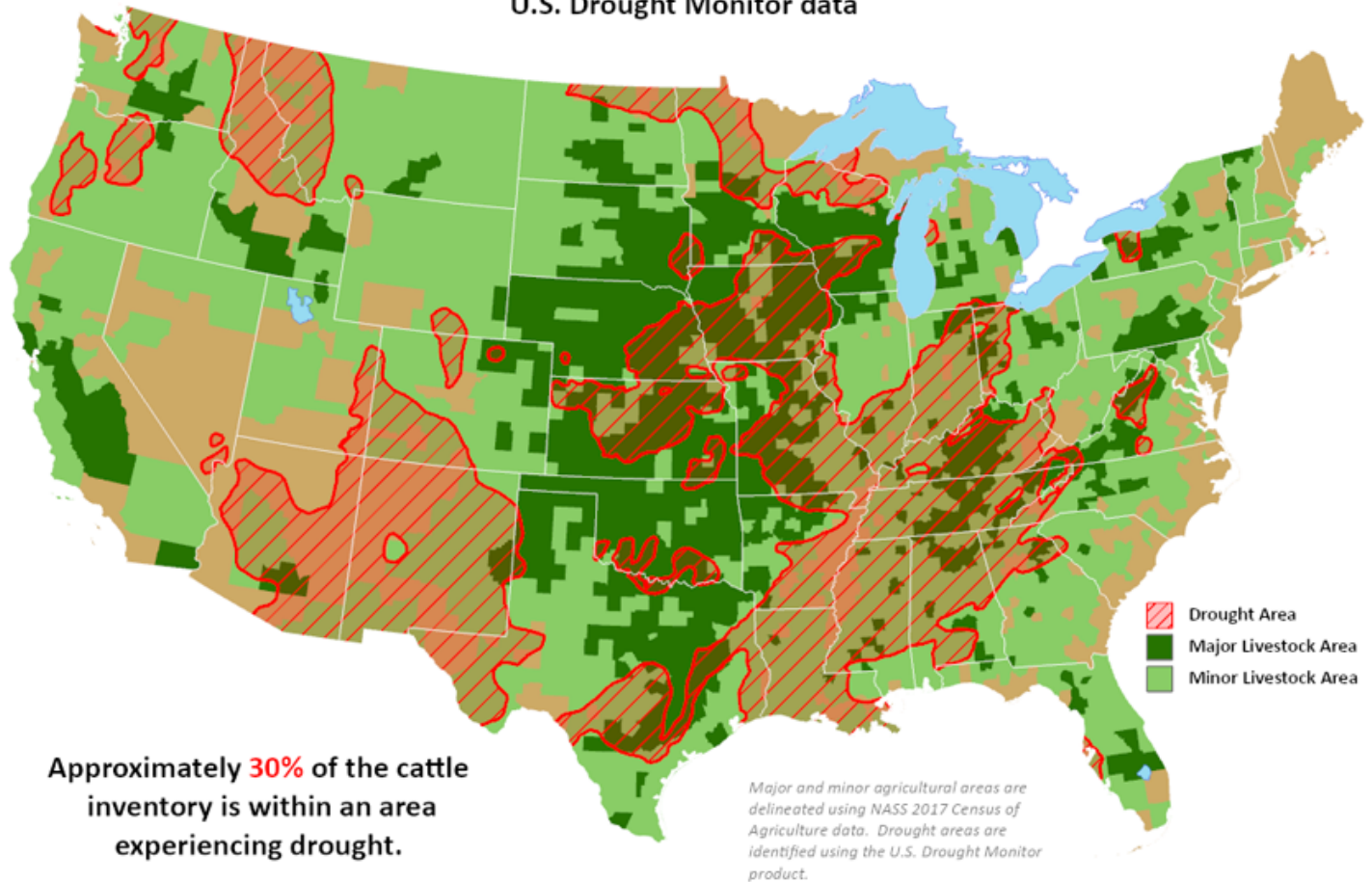

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### **Looking ahead...**

**During the next five days (January 11-15)**, a storm system is forecast to develop and intensify east of the Rockies, bringing potentially heavy rain and snow to parts of the eastern U.S. In the wake of this storm system bitterly cold temperatures are forecast to spill southward from Canada, leading to dangerously cold temperatures and wind chills across portions of the central and northern U.S.

**The 6-10 day outlook (valid January 16-20)**, favors enhanced chances of below normal temperatures across much of the lower 48 states, with the highest chances (greater than 90%) centered over the Middle Mississippi Valley. Conversely, above normal temperatures are favored in the southwest U.S., underneath a mid-level ridge of high pressure that is forecast. Below normal precipitation is favored across many areas east of the Rockies during the next 6-10 days, as dry air moves in behind a departing storm system. However, a frontal boundary is forecast to remain draped across the Gulf of Mexico, bringing increased above normal precipitation chances to southern Texas and the Florida Peninsula. Above normal precipitation is also favored across parts of the West Coast, northern Rockies, and northern High Plains, associated with moist southwesterly flow into the northwestern U.S.

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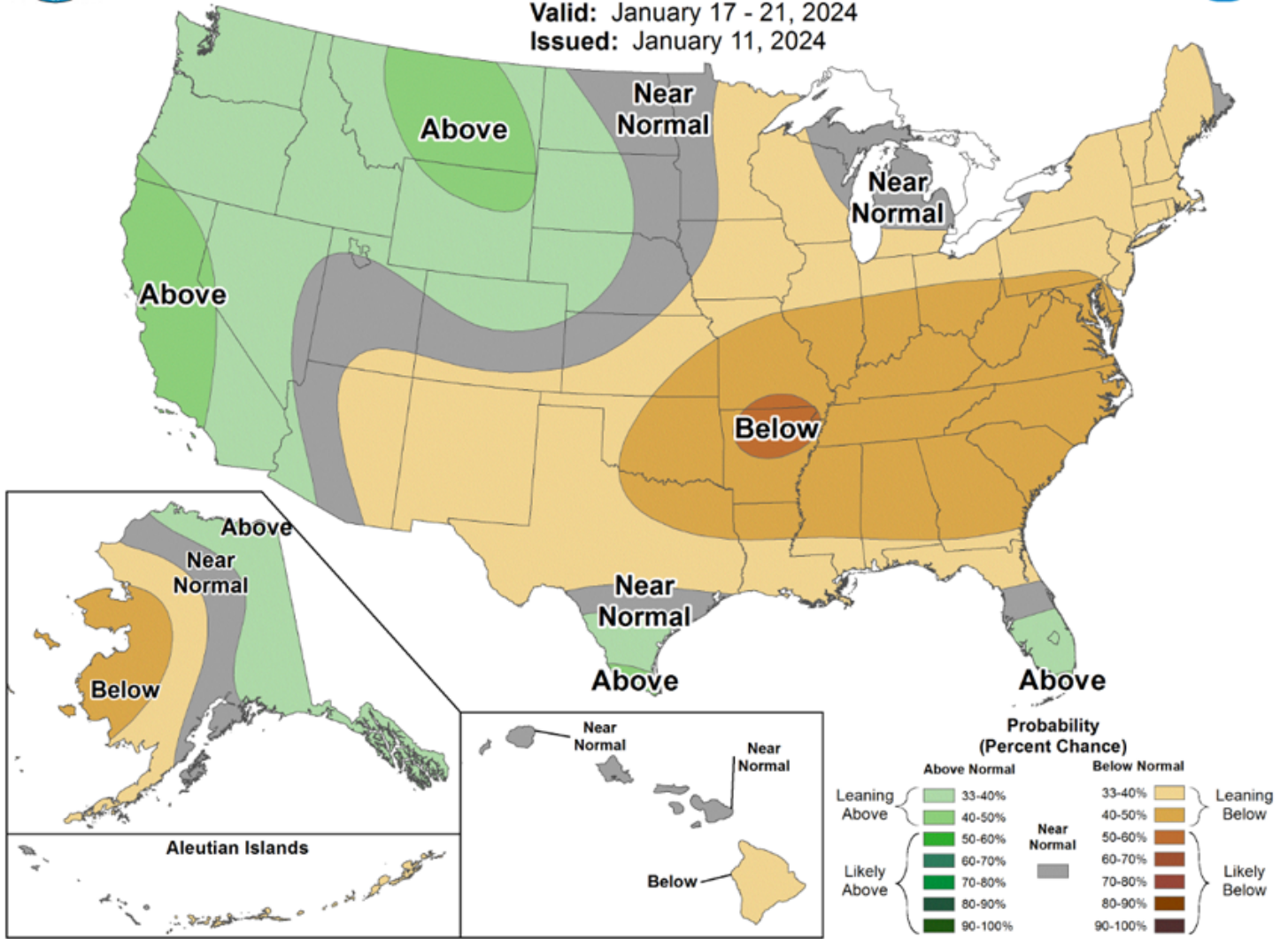

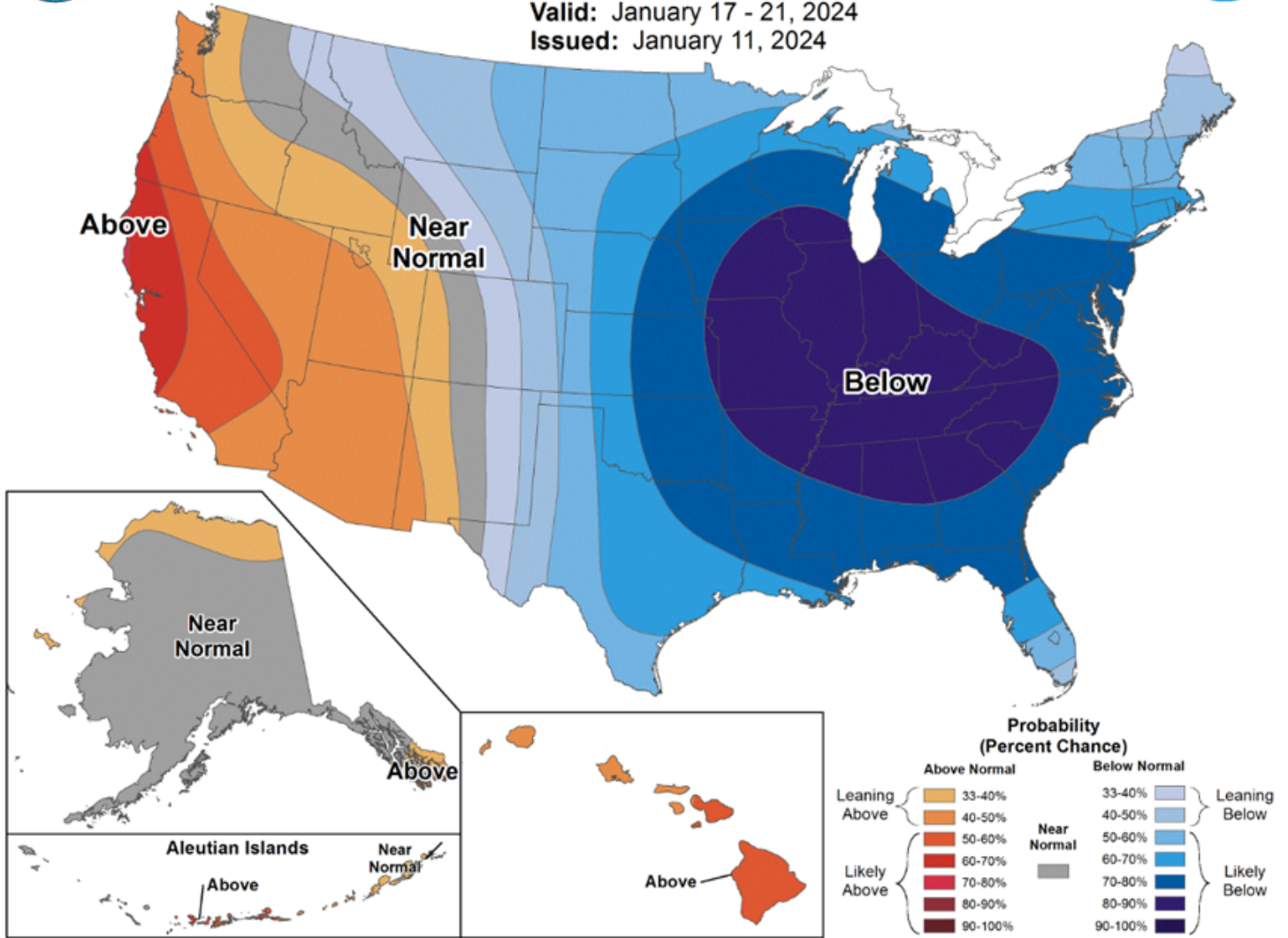
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# 6-10 Day Temperature Outlook

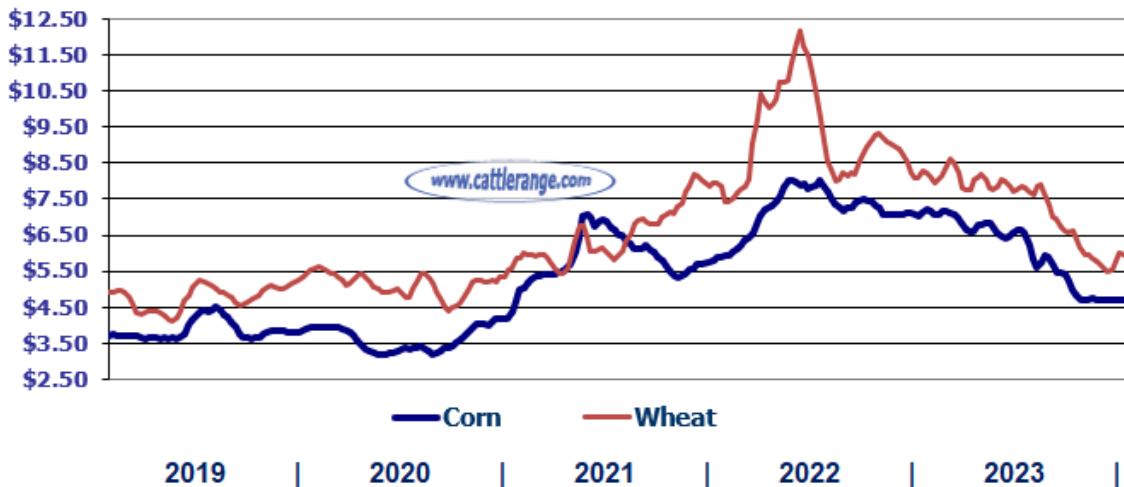
